

Past Perfect Continuous or Past Simple 2

Choose the right option: past simple or past perfect continuous. In some cases, both options are correct.

- 1. I hadn't been waiting / didn't wait for my friend for long before she finally arrived / had been arriving.
- 2. They *played / had been playing* video games all night, so they *were / had been being* very tired the next day.
- 3. She didn't study / hadn't been studying for her exams before she took them.
- 4. We walked / had been walking in the park when it suddenly started / had been starting to rain.
- 5. He worked / had been working on the project for months before he submitted / had been submitting it.
- 6. A: Why did you look / had you been looking so upset?B: I had / had been having a rough day at work.
- 7. We *didn't discuss / hadn't been discussing* the issue for a while when the manager *joined / had been joining* the meeting.
- 8. He *drove / had been driving* for two hours when he *realized / had been realizing* he was lost.
- 9.A: Why did you cry / had you been crying during the movie?B: I felt / had been feeling very emotional.
- 10.1 didn't read / hadn't been reading the book for a long time before I finished / had been finishing it.
